South Lakes PTI Hub 2023-2024

I would like to thank all of the schools who were able to take part in the South Lakes Primary Hub this academic year. Working with The PTI (Princes Teachers Institute) has proven to be a valuable investment in our teachers and ultimately our children. I knew that the PTI provided excellent speakers and teacher leaders to inspire teachers but it was still a huge gamble to get involved, one which I hope you felt paid off.

The educationalist, Robert John Meehan said that *'The most valuable resource our teachers have is each other. Without collaboration our growth is limited to our own perspectives*'. The aim of the PTI Hub has been to bring subject leads, teachers, HLTAs and senior leaders together. The days hopefully have been able to develop subject knowledge, provide inspiration and develop valuable pedagogy to support the curriculum and have a huge impact in schools. Most importantly, we hope that colleagues feel invested in and part of a collaborative partnership.

By taking part this year, schools could take part in the three face to face curriculum days, access resources in the PTI staffroom and take part in three online sessions (this year focusing on maths). If headteachers complete an impact statement afterwards on the PTI Staffroom, we can also receive the prestigious PTI Hub Mark. This is a recognised sign of high quality investment in the curriculum.

Finances are limited at the present time and therefore it is essential that schools get value for money when it comes to training and investing in their curriculum. We hope that you have found the training value for money and that the impact in our school this year has proven to be an investment in your children's education. As governors monitor the curriculum in our respective schools, we hope that subject leads will be able to articulate the impact of the training on their pedagogy and leadership. We also hope that leaders feel a part of a network of schools locally and as part of a wider network of hubs around the country.

Listening to Headteachers, we chose history, science and art this year as the curriculum areas to explore with a wider environmental theme of 'Think Globally Act Locally'. Assuming there continues to be interest in taking part next year, we hope to consider Geography, Music and Design Technology next year, following feedback from colleagues (although we do want to hear from all colleagues getting involved).

To make the PTI Hub viable we need to continue to engage 27-30 schools in the south. In the north, the demand is very high and the hub is considering splitting into two hubs to cope with the amount of schools taking part. Hopefully, we can continue to build on this year and connect our subject leads in a meaningful and sustainable way. I have also spoken to the LA to see if they would be able to support the training financially to ensure the hub is sustained. It will cost approximately £400 per school to take part.

Many thanks for your participation this year and we look forward to gathering our schools together very soon to celebrate the achievements of this year. We are encouraging headteachers to discuss the PTI Hub with cluster colleagues who may not have taken part this year, to try to get everyone involved next year. Please do discuss the impact of the training with your colleagues. I hope the following feedback will help you as you evaluate the impact in your own school.
